The use of Pearson correlation, regression analysis, and ANOVA is appropriate for the research objectives. This is critical when dealing with sensitive issues like employee turnover.</li></ul> <p>Potential Bias: The selection of respondents appears well-</p>

However, the lack of detail on how potential biases (e.g., social desirability bias) were mitigated during data collection raises ethical concerns regarding the accuracy and authenticity of the responses.
